The University of Saskatchewan, College of Medicine and the Saskatoon Health Region are pleased to introduce you to Dr. Olufemi Olatunbosun, Unified Department Head for the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology & Reproductive Sciences. Dr. Olatunbosun was appointed to this position in June 2004 for a five-year term.

Dr. Olatunbosun came to Saskatoon from Nigeria and has an impressive history with the Saskatoon Health Region and the College of Medicine. He received his MD in Nigeria in 1973 from the University of Lagos and completed his internship and residency at Lagos University Teaching Hospital. From 1977 to 1981 Dr. Olatunbosun was a Resident in Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Saskatchewan, followed by a Gynecologic Oncology Fellow from the Saskatoon Cancer Clinic, Royal University Hospital, University of Saskatchewan. He returned to Nigeria for a few years to take on the role of Director of the Assisted Reproduction Program at St. Nicholas Hospital in Lagos. He returned to Saskatoon in 1992 and has consistently been promoted to various positions within the College and health region since his return. In addition, Dr. Olatunbosun is a consultant in International Reproductive Health with WHO and United Nations Population Fund.

Dr. Olatunbosun has earned many honours, medals, fellowships and awards throughout his career, some of which include: the National Faculty Award for Excellence in Resident Education by the Council on Resident Education in Obstetrics and Gynecology (2004), Who's Who in Black Canada (2003), and the Excellence in Teaching Award, Faculty, College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan (2000).

In addition to a busy clinical practice, Dr. Olatunbosun is an active clinical researcher. He teaches extensively at the College of Medicine and lectures at length nationally and internationally.
