Dr. Tempier came to Canada from France where he earned his specialty degrees in psychiatry from the University of Aix-Marseille II in 1978. Continuing his education after his arrival in Canada in 1981, he earned his Certificate of Specialty in 1983 and his Master of Sciences in Community Health with a Research option at the University of Montreal in 1997. Dr. Tempier is well known for his teaching expertise. An avid researcher, he has been awarded many grants for a long list of projects he has investigated over the years. His research interests are in mental health service organizations and policies. He is especially interested in the collaborative care model where primary care professionals articulate their care with mental health specialists. In addition, he is also interested in the treatment and rehabilitation of severe mental disorders. Dr. Tempier has published more than 75 papers and more than 100 abstracts in articles related to mental health and addictions. He has lectured extensively, both nationally and internationally.

Dr. Tempier is pleased to continue his role as Unified Department Head and looks forward to working with colleagues within the Department, across the University and the Saskatoon Health Region in addition to collaborating with national and international groups of researchers in social psychiatry and epidemiology.
