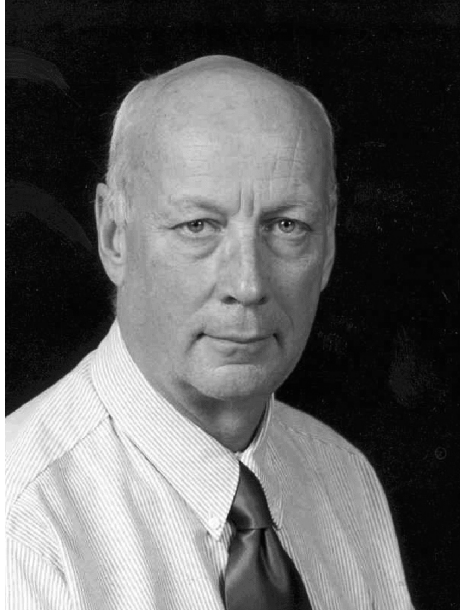

The University of Saskatchewan, College of Medicine and the Saskatoon Health Region are pleased to introduce you to Dr. Thomas W. Wilson, Unified Department Head for the Department of Medicine. Dr. Wilson was appointed to this position in 2003 for a five-year term.

Dr. Wilson received his MD from the University of Alberta in 1967, and his M.Sc. and FRCPC from the University of Toronto in 1972.

In 1973 Dr. Wilson joined the faculty of the College of Medicine at the University of Saskatchewan where he was appointed Assistant Professor of Pharmacology. He moved into the position of Associate Professor, Department of Medicine in 1981. In 1984 he was promoted to Professor for the Department of Pharmacology and Medicine and was Head of the Department of Pharmacology from 1997 to 2003. Dr. Wilson is an active staff member of the Saskatoon Health Region and the College of Medicine. Throughout his career, he has shown his leadership through his involvement in many committees, some as their chair and others as a member and is the Founding Director of the Cardiovascular Risk Factor Reduction Unit.

In addition to an active teaching schedule, Dr. Wilson is also committed to the area of research and has published an impressive list of articles in many well known journals and books. He is recognized for his contributions to the community and has facilitated several public lectures and produced a number of audio recordings educating the public on personal health issues. His popular lecture "How to Live to be 100" was also shown on Shaw Cable 10 in Saskatoon.

Dr. Wilson has earned many honours, medals, fellowships and awards throughout his career, some of which include: Listed in Canada's Who's Who in 2006, Saskatchewan Centennial Medal recipient (2006), Clinical Teacher of the Year (2001), and the Royal University Hospital Foundation, Tony Dagnone "Spirit of RUH Award" (1999).

Dr. Wilson is pleased to continue his role as Unified Department Head and looks forward to working with colleagues within the Department, across the University and the Saskatoon Health Region.
