The Purpose

A developmental disability is defined as any mental or physical impairment that occurs early in development. It can result in significant limitations and usually requires special services throughout one's lifetime.

Examples:

- Cerebral palsy
- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Seizure Disorder
- Intellectual disability
- Muscular Dystrophy
- Down Syndrome
- Spina Bifida
- Traumatic Brain Injury

Any kind of diagnosis to one's health can cause a disruption to family balance. When a child is diagnosed with a developmental disability, parents can be left wondering:

- ◆ What does this mean?
- ◆ How does this affect my family and my child?
- ◆ What can I do to help my child?
- ◆ What else is out there?

There are no easy answers to these questions, but they are concerns and fears felt and expressed by many parents.

The purpose of our one-session seminar is to provide parents and family with an understanding of how any kind of diagnosis can create family imbalance, and what is needed to regain some balance.

Who can attend: parents who have recently learned their child has a diagnosis, or parents who have reached an awareness that their child has a permanent disability but has a non-specific diagnosis.
