Position profile – Saskatoon Health Region is seeking a full-time Hematopathologist. Training or experience in Molecular Pathology or pediatric diagnosis would be an asset. The Department combines academic, research, and service components and has an accredited residency training program in general pathology and provides training at the undergraduate, graduate, and post-doctoral levels. The Division of Hematopathology is staffed currently with 4 Hematopathologists.

Compensation details – salary scale is \$ 316,110 - \$363,526 (Cdn). Pathologists enjoy a generous vacation and benefits package.

Location of practice – Saskatoon

Qualifications / Requirements of the position – Candidates must hold an MD degree, have completed specialty training in anatomical pathology, be eligible for licensing with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan and hold or be eligible for specialty certification with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.
