What is the High Risk Breast Cancer Clinic?

The clinic helps to identify, coordinate and develop a treatment plan for men and women who are at higher risk of developing breast cancer.

Who should attend the High Risk Breast Cancer Clinic?

The clinic is open to anyone who has any of the following:

- Strong family history of breast cancer including male breast cancer
- Strong family history of ovarian cancer
- History of Hodgkins Lymphoma treated with Mantle Radiation
- High risk benign pathology including lobular carcinoma in situ (LCIS) and atypical hyperplasia (ALH and ADH)
- Have an inherited breast cancer gene (BRCA1 or BRCA2)
- Have a first degree relative with a BRCA1 or BRCA2 mutation

Both women and men can be at risk for developing breast cancer.

How do I get referred to the clinic?

Referrals can be made by your family doctor, nurse practitioner or specialist.

Once the referral is received, you will get a call to book an appointment to be seen at the clinic.

What services does the clinic offer?

At your first clinic visit you will meet a breast surgeon and a registered nurse. They will:

- go over your medical and family history;
- develop a treatment plan specific to your risk of developing breast cancer;
- provide information to reduce risk; and
- for women with BRCA1 or BRCA2 - discuss your risk of developing ovarian cancer and suggest ways to reduce that risk.

A summary of your personalized plan will be sent to you and your family doctor.

If you need to see other healthcare providers specific to your breast cancer risk, referrals will be made by the clinic.
