Who Do We Serve?

The Young Offender Team within Child and Youth Programs is a multidisciplinary team that provides treatment and assessment services for youth who are involved in the criminal justice system and have committed offences between the ages of 12—17.

Goal

To assist these youth and families in improving their lives in order to reduce crime and protect the citizens of Saskatoon.



Services Offered

1. General Forensic Services

Services: Assessment, Treatment

- General Forensic Service is the service that reduces risk of re-offending and is provided when a client does not meet the criteria for other services. *It includes anger management, supportive counseling while on remand, non-violent offending, and violent specific (but not HRVYOI or IRCS) treatment.*

2. HRVYOI (High Risk Violent Young Offender Initiative)

Services: Assessment, Treatment

- The HRVYOI program provides violence specific treatment for young offenders who have committed a serious violent offence or who have committed at least 2 separate violent offences. A separate referral form is required for this program.

3. IRCS (Intensive Rehabilitative Custody and Supervision Sentence)

Services: Assessment, Treatment

- Psychological assessments (court ordered or post-sentence) are offered to young offenders who have committed specific serious violent offences. These assessments determine if youth have a mental health condition that qualifies them to receive additional federal funding for rehabilitative services to reduce risk for re-offending. Referrals are made through court orders or through an IRCS coordinator (post-sentence).

Services Offered

4. Sex Offender Services

Services: Assessment, Individual and Group Treatment

- Sex Offender Services include assessment (of clinical needs and risk to re-offend) and treatment. Treatment is tailored to be responsive to the individual's needs. Both group and individual treatment may be involved in providing comprehensive treatment to clients.

5. Forensic Substance Management Services

Services: Assessment, Individual and Group Treatment

- Treatment focuses on a client's substance use and its connection to their criminal behavior. Therapeutic and psychoeducational groups are provided in secure and open custody and the community.
