

**Saskatchewan's new maternal and children's hospital will have...**

- 100% private patient rooms with dedicated sleep space for supportive partners or a family member.
- capacity to see double the number of children and teenagers we see today in the new pediatric outpatient clinic with almost 3 times more exam rooms.
- dedicated space within pediatric outpatients for x-rays and ultrasounds. The hospital will also support the development of pediatric phlebotomy. These individuals will be able to help reduce the pain and fear associated with blood draws for children.
- dedicated space for children and teenagers battling cancer to receive their chemotherapy treatments or multi-hour infusions for antibiotics or medications in a child-friendly environment through pediatric outpatients.
- room to treat over 21,000 children and teenagers each year in the new pediatric emergency department.
- individual rooms with solid walls and doors giving parents and their children complete privacy in the new pediatric emergency department.
- space to care for over 4,000 children and teenagers each year who require overnight stays in hospital.
- a dedicated pediatric procedure room where complex procedures can be carried. This will, in many cases, mean children may not have to be moved to the operating rooms.
- an outdoor play space on the pediatric floor dedicated for children and families who are staying in hospital.
- a new pediatric hemodialysis room where children with chronic kidney failure will be able to receive treatment.
- a new pediatric sleep lab which will mean children will no longer have to travel out of province for pediatric sleep studies.
- space to care for over 6,000 pregnant women per year.
- all maternal care services on one floor. Many pregnant women will now be able to labour, give birth and stay with their new baby in one private room. Each room will have dedicated sleep space for a supportive partner.
- will have three dedicated maternal operating rooms on the maternal floor with a direct patient elevator connection to neonatal intensive care.
- 100% dedicated private rooms in neonatal intensive care with rooms specifically set up for twins. There will be space for a parent to stay with baby in the private NICU patient room.
- many dedicated family spaces throughout all areas of the hospital.
- the first dedicated pediatric surgery suites for Saskatchewan. There will be three dedicated, integrated pediatric operating rooms with induction rooms. Induction rooms will allow parents to be with their child while anaesthesia is being administered.
- a theatre in the lobby for events or movies for children and teenagers staying in hospital.
- a dedicated space for child-minding where parents will be able to receive short-term child care services for siblings while parents' bring their child for an appointment.
- a dedicated non-denominational spiritual space for parents and families.
