### **Dr. Munier Nour**

Dr. Munier Nour joined the Department of Pediatrics with Saskatoon Health Region and University of Saskatchewan's College of Medicine in 2014 from Alberta Children's Hospital in Calgary. He completed his speciality training at the University of Calgary, along with his medical doctorate and master's degree. He completed his pediatric residency program from Queen's University.

Dr. Nour has received awards for teaching excellence from the University of Calgary and Queen's University, and in 2012, was a recipient of the Canadian Pediatric Endocrinology Fellowship award from the Canadian Pediatric Endocrine Group. He has also received training in pediatric bone densitometry from the International Society for Clinical Densitometry.

Dr. Nour is Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada having completed specialization in Endocrinology & Metabolism, General Pediatrics and the Clinician Investigator Program.

Also a published researcher, Dr. Nour's interests include examining pediatric osteoporosis, as well as the effects of growth hormone treatment in Turner Syndrome.
